Thinking of Family Planning and Reproductive Health?

Family planning and reproductive health is the treatment of and provision of health services for patients in relation to contraception, reproductive health and associated primary sexual health issues.

Overview of Family Planning and Reproductive Health

There are Family Planning clinics from Whangarei to Invercargill and many have doctor vacancies. An advantage is being able to work part time. Doctors enjoy working as part of a team alongside nurses who are expanding their practice. National protocols ensure that clinical practice is constantly up dated.

Most Family Planning doctors are women as are the majority of the clients. There are 24 doctors vocationally registered and 8 current trainees in Family Planning and Reproductive Health.

Specialty training

On the job training is provided for all new doctors. In addition the Diploma of Sexual and Reproductive Health is the qualification for vocational registration in Family Planning and Reproductive Health.

Duration of vocational training:

- 3 year Diploma of Sexual and Reproductive Health includes
- Theory modules with Auckland or Otago University
- Clinical placements in gynaecology, sexual health and family planning and special interest topics
- Logbook
- OSCE exam

Specialty Training Programme Information

Examination requirements

An OSCE exam is held annually in conjunction with the Diploma in Obstetrics and Medical Gynaecology OSCE Recognition of Prior Learning

Prior experience is considered e.g. Diploma of Obstetrics and Medical Gynaecology within last 3 years

Entry requirement and application process

- Hold current registration with the New Zealand Medical Council, and be a member of a recognised Medical Insurance Society
- Have held a medical qualification as approved by the Diploma committee for at least 24 months.

Selection criteria

- Ability to access clinical placements in gynaecology, sexual health and family planning (may need to travel to a main centre)
- Ability to complete the diploma within 3 years
- Funding is available for 5 candidates at a time
